The ship has been aground since October, 1960, it is desired to refer the case to The Committee to record a casualty notation.</p> <p><i>JA</i></p>	<p>Date:— 16th February 1961. Copy of our reply dated 13th January 1961. The above named ship stranded 10 miles North Chittagong still ashore, as far as can be ascertained from ship's Agents now up for sale as she lies, the possibility of re-floating looks extremely remote as ship is lying approx. $\frac{1}{2}$ mile from water at low tide. All cargo has now been discharged and of the officers only the Master, 3rd Officer and 4th Engineer Officer remain on board.</p>
