EXAMINATION AND REPAIRS AS PER RULE FOR DAMAGE SURVEY AND PART PERMANENT AND TEMPORARY REPAIRS, GENERAL EXAMINATION FOR POSTPONEMENT OF SPECIAL SURVEY UNTIL December 1958.

The vessel has been placed in drydock for grounding as previously reported (Swansea Rpt. 8-57). On examination no damage to bottom or shell could be found.

Now damage: The vessel was reported to have sustained the following damages stated to have been caused by heavy weather during voyage Bonges - Hamburg in December 1957.

- 2 fractures in forward bulkhead of centre tank 9.
- 2 fractures in p.s. long bulkhead of centre tank 9.
- 1 fracture in s.b. longitudinal bulkhead of centre tank 9.
- 1 fracture in p.s. longitudinal bulkhead of centre tank 7.

In connection with the above the following repairs have been carried out:-

- 2 insert plates fitted in forward bulkhead of centre tank 9.
- 1 insert plate/fitted in p.s. longitudinal bulkhead of centre tank 9, and 1 double plate
- 1 double plate fitted on s.b. longitudinal of centre tank 9.

REMARKS, REPAIRS, Etc. (Contd.) 4) a double plate fitted in p.s. longitudinal bulkhead of centre tank 7. The double plate on p. & s. longitudinal bulkhead of centre tanks 9 & 7 has been fitted as temporary repairs, there was no opportunity to carry out permanent repairs now, as the vessel was urgently needed. It has been recommended same being specially examined next drydocking.
