the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of Messrs. John G. Kincaid & Co., Ltd., Engineers, Greenock, survey during construction Two Steel Air Reservoirs intended for their Engine No. K.115 - Messrs. Lithgows Limited's Ship No. 908.

The scantlings are in accordance with the Rules for a working pressure of 350 lbs. per square inch.

The material has been tested by the Surveyors to this Society.

These Reservoirs were tested in the presence of the undersigned to a hydraulic pressure of 575 lbs. per square inch, and found tight at that pressure.

The working pressure should not exceed three hundred and fifty pounds per square inch.
