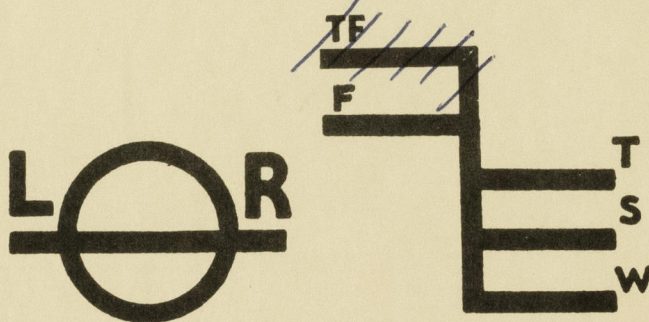
Load Line.

Tropical 7 feet 7 inches. (T) 4 inches above S.

Summer 7 feet 11 inches. (S) Upper edge of line through centre of disc.

Winter 8 feet 3 inches. (W) 4 inches below S.

Allowance for fresh water for all freeboards 4 inches.

The upper edge of the deck line from which these freeboards are measured is - inches
above the top of the steel upper deck at side.

"When engaged on the Great Lakes and River St. Lawrence, Rule 99 of the Canadian Load Line Rules for vessels making voyages on Lakes and Rivers will apply."

This is to certify that this ship has been surveyed and the freeboards and load lines shown above have been assigned in accordance with the provisions of the Canada Shipping Act, 1934, and apply only whilst engaged in Great Lakes and Gulf of St. Lawrence Service.

This Certificate remains in force until 2nd October, 1962.

NOTE.—Where sea-going steamships navigate a river or inland water, deeper loading is permitted corresponding to the weight of fuel, etc., required for consumption between the point of departure and the open sea. The Annual Survey becomes due in October each year.
