With reference to my report on the machinery of the steamer "LITHERWOOD", J.S. White & Cos, No. 1562, I beg to acquaint you that there is a slight porosity, on the forward side, near the bottom of the I.P. cylinder, which is in my opinion, not detrimental in any way to the safe working of the engine, and it was pointed out to, and seen by, the owners superintendent engineer, who also is of the same opinion as myself and took no objection to it.

In consequence however I have recommended to the latter gentleman that this cylinder be examined again in six months, which time he stated the vessel will have completed her first voyage, and the guaranteed time be finished. This the owners superintendent quite agreed to.
