while she lay afloat at 8 Alexandra Dock Bombay on 23rd January 1963 for the purpose of ascertaining if the ship is in a fit condition to be anchored in Bombay Harbour, on discharge of cargo, the ship having been towed from Aden after suffering a severe engine room fire at that port.

A survey was held at Aden by a Surveyor to this Society and a certificate issued covering the ship's fitness for the voyage in tow to Bombay.

The voyage was successfully completed and as it been ascertained at this time from a statement by the Master and from the log books that no casualty has occurred since the last survey at Aden the ship is considered, in my opinion, to be fit to lie at anchor in Bombay Harbour for a period of two months from this date i.e. until 23rd March 1963.
