Steamer "DISCOVERY II"

In confirmation of our telephone conversations today, I have to say that for the issue of a certificate to cover a voyage from Plymouth to Passage West the Committee will require a General Examination of the hull and machinery not less stringent than the requirements of Circular No.1959, and the ship to be found or placed in a satisfactory condition for the proposed voyage. The question of drydocking will be left to your discretion and the certificate, when issued, should cover the voyage with class temporarily suspended.

The Boiler Survey became due at the end of January last and for the voyage the boilers should be examined under steam.

A short term Load Line certificate may be issued by you when the requirements of a Load Line Renewal Survey have been carried out in conjunction with the General Examination.
