Steamer "ADHERITY"

Your letter addressed to the Society's Surveyors at Ipswich on the 2nd November has now received the consideration of the Committee here in conjunction with the inspection which was held by the Surveyors at Yarmouth earlier this month.

It is noted that the vessel has been seen both afloat and in drydock, and that a General Examination, with a view to the postponement of the Special Survey, has also been held. The condition of the vessel was found to be generally satisfactory except that the upper structure of the tanks and trunk sides are somewhat wasted in Nos. 1, 2 and 3 cargo tanks.

The Committee have been informed of your desire to postpone permanent repairs until July, 1961, until which time she will be employed in the vicinity of the River Thames. In these circumstances the Committee are agreeable to the vessel's class remaining undisturbed until July, 1961, on the definite understanding that, in the meantime, her service will be restricted to the River Thames and Estuary.

A Load Line Certificate, bearing these limitations, will be issued in due course.
