SOURCE OF INFORMATION

TEDDY. — Cullercoats Radio, Nov. 14. — Following received from Lyngby Radio: At 7 48 p.m., G.M.T.: XXX (urgency signal), following received from Danish auxiliary vessel Griben, OWJE: Picked up four men from Danish motor vessel Teddy, OXMU, sunk in approximate position Kriegersflak, lat. 55 2 N., long. 13 E.

At 8 20 p.m., G.M.T.: Teddy sunk at 6 30 p.m., G.M.T., Nov. 13, in approximate position Kriegersflak, lat. 55 2 N., long. 13 E.; 12 men missing.

At 8 43 p.m., G.M.T.: Teddy sunk 6 30 p.m., Nov. 13, within two minutes in position four miles east of Moen Lighthouse. Four men saved, 12 men missing. No boat launched, only a rubber dinghy. Motor vessel Lise Hojsgaard and German steamer Diana will be at position in one to two hours. Minelayer Vindhunden will be there in five hours.

At 10 38 p.m., G.M.T.: Teddy sunk at 6 30 p.m., G.M.T., Nov. 13, in position lat. 55 2 4 N., long. 13 6 E. Four men in dinghy saved to-night by Griben four miles south of Moen Lighthouse, 12 men missing. Griben, motor vessel Lise Hojsgaard, motor vessel Fenja, OXKM, and German steamer Diana, DJDR, searching in area. Danish naval vessel will be there at about 3 a.m., Nov. 15.

At 11 29 p.m., G.M.T.: Reference XXX re Teddy, position at 11 p.m. for following vessels: Lise Hojsgaard lat. 55 6 N., long. 13 8 E., course 225 deg., Diana lat. 55 3 N., long. 13 8 30 E., course 241 deg., Fenja lat. 55 45 30 N., long. 12 30 30 E., course for Falsterbo, Griben lat. 55 2 N., long. 13 6 E., course for Falsterbo.

Copenhagen, Nov. 15. — An intense air and sea search is being made to-day for 12 missing members of the crew of Danish motor vessel Teddy, which sank late on Monday (Nov. 13) near Moen, the Naval Command said here to-day. Four of the crew, including the first mate, were rescued from a dinghy last night and the mate reported that the Teddy filled and sank immediately after being hit by a giant wave during a violent storm.—Reuter.

Copenhagen, Nov. 15. — Danish motor vessel Teddy, Swinoujscie for Mariager, cargo limestone, foundered in Baltic Sea on Nov. 13 during heavy weather. Four of crew picked up from liferaft last night and now landed at Ronne.

TEDDY.—Copenhagen, Nov. 19.—Motor vessel Teddy was located yesterday in 15 to 20 metres of water at Kriegersflak. —“Borsen.” (See issue of Nov. 16.)

TEDDY. — Copenhagen, Nov. 20.—Tug Sigyn anchored yesterday at Kriegersflak, where motor vessel Teddy is lying sunk in 20 metres of water. The wreck will be examined at daybreak. —“Borsen.” (See issue of Nov. 21.)

TEDDY. — Copenhagen, Nov. 21. — Salvage tug Sigyn completed examination by diver of motor vessel Teddy yesterday. The vessel is lying on starboard side in 20 metres of water south-east of Moen. So far as could be seen by divers, there was no hull leakage but all hatches had been washed away. None of the crew was found.—“Borsen.” (See issue of Nov. 23.)
