PROVISIONAL LOAD LINE CERTIFICATE.

the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of the Owners' Representative survey the s.s. "KEYNOR", 1806 tons gross on Montreal on the 19th February, 1948 and subsequently, whilst afloat in Albert Dock and in Central Dry Dock, Hull for the purpose of issuing a provisional load line certificate for the proposed voyage to Canada.
