PARTS OF MACHINERY EXAMINED NOW. The three generator prime movers and auxiliary circulating pump stripped, examined and repaired, and afterwards examined under working conditions. Steam separator casting in auxiliary steam line to generators. Broken longitudinal stay (lower centre) in forward centre boiler repaired by welding.
