Examined holds, decks, structure below main engines and boiler, engine and boiler room spaces as far as practicable, bunker above coal, fore and after peaks internally, casings, houses, hatches, ventilators and their coamings, closing appliances, steering gear and it's connections, windlass and general equipment.

REPAIRS WEAR & TEAR (CONTD.) :-

No.2 hatch coaming forward corner plates, port and starboard sides, renewed.  
Plating hose tested on completion of repairs and found satisfactory.  
Hatch beam receivers on Nos.1 & 2 hatches - all renewed.  
Steering gear chains annealed and examined.  
Engine room skylight glasses, 2 port and 2 starboard - renewed.  
10 hatch covers renewed.  
Sundry minor repairs.

This vessel, as far as now seen, is in an efficient condition and in view of the General Examination now held, the Special Survey may, in my opinion, be deferred until March, 1963.

The Annual Freeboard Survey also carried out at this time.

The riveting and caulking of the set up bottom shell plating examined and found satisfactory.
