I have to acquaint you that there is shewn on Montreal First Entry Report No. 3089 on the steamer "FLEURDELIS" an item of \$325 for New York expenses. It appears that the Montreal Surveyor has now obtained payment of the whole of the fees due for the surveys he has held on this vessel, and, in addition, his own expenses amounting to \$140.50, but there is no trace in his accounts of the receipt of the \$325 New York expenses. It is, however, observed that an entry of \$100 for expenses on the "FLEURDELIS" has been made in the New York Rough Fee Book (No. 8380).

There is also on Montreal Report No. 3077 an item of \$60 for New York expenses on the steamer "EMPIRE STATE" and here again the Surveyor appears to have collected the whole of the fees for the survey of this vessel, plus his own expenses, but not those for New York.

I should be obliged if you would kindly let me know precisely what is the position with regard to these expenses due to your port. If they have been paid I should like to know in what returns their receipt is recorded, and I should, moreover, be pleased to learn the reason for the difference between the figures of \$325 and \$100 given as New York expenses on the "FLEURDELIS".
