#### COMPASSES.

Minimum distance between electric <sup>fan</sup>generators or motors and standard compass 25 ft  
Minimum distance between electric <sup>fan</sup>generators or motors and steering compass 20 ft

The nearest cables to the compasses are as follows:—

A cable carrying 0.9 Ampères led into feet from standard compass led into feet from steering compass.  
A cable carrying 36 Ampères 4 feet from standard compass 3 feet from steering compass.  
A cable carrying 15 Ampères 7 feet from standard compass 5 feet from steering compass.

Have the compasses been adjusted with and without the electric installation at work at full power Yes  
Has the effect of switching on and off circuits, motors and other electro-magnetic apparatus within the vicinity of the compasses been noted Yes  
The maximum deviation due to electric currents was found to be Nil degrees on any course in the case of the
