PICTON.—Vancouver, Nov. 10.—Steamer Picton, one of two steamers being towed here, for conversion into barges, by tug N. R. LANG, has been left at Cristobal because of damage sustained during a hurricane. Steamers Picton and DAVID BARCLAY were taken in tow at Lauzon by the N. R. LANG, which was forced to heave to for four days at the Bahamas in a hurricane. The ships were two of 12 recently purchased by the Powell River Company, Ltd., for conversion into fuel barges. The N. R. LANG is towing the DAVID BARCLAY up the Pacific coast.—New York Maritime Association. (See issue of Nov. 9.)

This ship is in port at Cristobal, Panama, with extensive damage sustained while being towed from the Great Lakes to Vancouver.
