With reference to the notations of class of the M.V. "PORT FREMANTLE", I have to point out that the Donkey Boiler as fitted is intended to be worked at 100 lbs. per square inch, and not 125 as stated in the classing letter of the 12th instant.

This boiler was constructed for a working pressure of 125 lbs, but was substituted for the one intended to be fitted in the "PORT FREMANTLE" on account of the delay in obtaining the ^{material} for the construction of the latter boiler.
