SOURCE OF INFORMATION

NYON. — Niton Radio, June 15.—Following received from motor vessel Nyon, HBFC, (Antwerp and Bremen for Montreal) at 9 46 a.m., G.M.T.: SOS, Nyon in collision in position lat. 50 32 N., long. 1 30 W., making water fast.
Following received from British steamer Fort Sandusky, MAMT, at 9 57 a.m., G.M.T.: Am eight miles from casualty position and proceeding to position.
Following received from motor vessel JALAZAD, VWDF, (Chittagong for Antwerp, Bremen and Hamburg) at 10 3 a.m., G.M.T.: Nyon in collision with JALAZAD in position lat. 50 32 N., long. 1 30 W. Nyon making water fast. Standing by to pick up men from Nyon.

Dover, June 15. — Swiss motor vessel Nyon in collision in position lat. 50 32 N., long. 1 30 W., and making water fast. Tug Marimia on point of leaving Dover to offer assistance. Visibility this area fog patches lifting and falling.

Niton Radio, June 15.—Motor vessel Nyon: Following received from H.M. coastal minesweeper Wasperton at 10 12 a.m., G.M.T.: Am proceeding to distress position at full speed, estimated time of arrival 5 p.m., G.M.T.
Following received from motor vessel JALAZAD:
At 10 12 a.m., G.M.T.: Nyon sank. We are picking up survivors now, two boats from Nyon near. We do not require assistance ourselves.
At 10 25 a.m., G.M.T.: Nyon sank. We picked up all survivors safely; all well. We are now proceeding on normal course to Antwerp.

Dover, June 15.—Motor vessel Nyon has sunk. The colliding vessel is Indian and has taken the crew off the Nyon.

Niton Radio, June 15. — Reference collision motor vessel Nyon and Indian motor vessel JALAZAD, corrected position of collision is five miles south of Beachy Head. Nyon sank in that position. Position of lat. 50 32 N., long. 1 30 W., was given by ship in error.

Antwerp, June 15. — Collision reported between Swiss motor vessel Nyon and Indian motor vessel JALAZAD about 11 miles off Royal Sovereign Light-vessel a.m., June 15. According to advices received, Nyon sank, crew taken on board the JALAZAD.

Ymuiden, June 15. — Motor vessel Nyon: Immediately upon receipt of first report of collision we dispatched our tug Hector from Portsmouth to proceed to casualty. At 10 10 a.m., G.M.T., we received a message that Nyon sank and crew picked up by motor vessel JALAZAD. Now instructing Hector to return. — N.V. Bureau Wijsmuller.

London, June 15. — Indian motor vessel JALAZAD reported to-day that she had been in collision five miles south of Beachy Head in thick fog with Swiss motor vessel Nyon. Nyon was struck amidships near No. 3, starboard side. Stem of JALAZAD just above waterline holed for at least 15 ft.


