
Dear Sir,

We are in receipt of your letter of yesterday with regard to Newcastle Report No. 104761 on the Steamer "AVISMERE" ex "OCEAN VISION".

In reply we have to state that the record of General Examination is intended to be subject to the additional stiffening being carried out by the end of March 1948. It will be noted that in the body of the report it is mentioned that the stiffening in the bottom was recommended to be done at the time of survey in September last, but was deferred on account of the non-availability of the dry dock. If it should not be found convenient to do it next March, then the bottom should be re-examined at least.

With regard to the girder under the deck, it is considered that this should be fitted at the time of the Special Survey, and as both of these items were stated by Mr. J. Taylor, the Consulting Engineer, to be such as would be done in March, 1948, the exact wording of the recommendation on the report was chosen. With the exception of the items mentioned in this recommendation the condition of the whole of the ship elsewhere is, in our opinion, satisfactory for at least 12 months.
