The scantlings are in accordance with the Rules for a working pressure of 356 lbs. per square inch.

The material has been tested by the Surveyors to this Society.

These Reservoirs were tested in the presence of the undersigned to a hydraulic pressure of 556 lbs. per square inch, and found tight at that pressure.

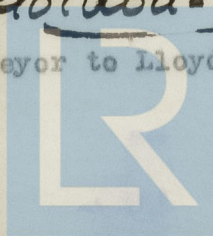
The working pressure should not exceed three hundred and fifty-six pounds.
