Details of Casualty

Struck pier and stranded in River Bann during heavy weather; refloated and towed to Coleraine. The ship sustained extensive damage, but temporary repairs enabled her to be towed to Port Glasgow.

Owners now state that she has been sold for breaking up.

SOURCE OF INFORMATION

TARANSAY. — Portrush, Oct. 3.—Motor vessel Taransay struck pier when entering Coleraine p.m. Saturday (Oct. 1) (from Glasgow). Vessel ashore inside river, rudder damaged, making water.

TARANSAY. — Portrush, Oct. 3.—Motor vessel Taransay, Glasgow for Coleraine, cargo animal feed, struck a pier with her stern when entering the mouth of the River Bann during heavy seas on Oct. 1. The vessel came clear but went aground on sand inside the River Bann. Rudder, propeller shaft and engines are damaged and the vessel is making water through stern glands. Weather to-day is rough, but the vessel is in no further danger. Attempts to tow the vessel to Coleraine are to be made with the rising tide later to-day. (See issue of Oct. 4.)

TARANSAY. — Portrush, Oct. 4.—Motor vessel Taransay was towed to Coleraine yesterday evening by steamer Serb and a local fishing vessel and is now discharging her cargo. She is still making some water, apparently through stern tubes, but there is no sign of water in the hold yet and no sign of any damage to cargo. It is understood that the owners hope to arrange to tow the vessel to Glasgow for repairs. (See issue of Oct. 5.)

TARANSAY. — Glasgow, Oct. 10.—Motor vessel Taransay passed Tail of the Bank, bound inwards, to-day, in tow, bound for James Lamont & Co., Ltd., Port Glasgow, with propeller shaft trouble. (See issue of Oct. 6.)

TARANSAY. — Portrush, Oct. 10.—Motor vessel Taransay left Coleraine yesterday, in tow of a tug, for Greenock. (See issues of Oct. 4 and '11.)


