the undersigned Surveyor to this Society, did, at the request of Captain Norregaard, the Master of M/S "ASTORIA" - 4454 tons gross of Copenhagen, attend upon the said Vessel when in dry dock for repairs etc. and make an examination of small damage stated to have been sustained by striking the Dock entrance when dry docking on the 7th inst.

For further particulars, see Ship's Log Books - translated extract of which was submitted as relating to this damage.

ON EXAMINATION FOUND:- The shell plating indented about one and a quarter inches from normal in one frame space of "F" strake No.4 plate from stem starboard side. Rivets and caulking in the vicinity not disturbed.

AS RECOMMENDED AND NOW DONE:- This indent in shell plating faired in place, and an inside doubling approx. two feet square fitted between the frames and efficiently riveted to shell.
