Dear Sirs,

I duly received your letters of the 22nd ultimo regarding your trawlers "STALBERG" and "GROSMONT CASTLE" and am very sorry to learn from the Swansea Surveyors that Mr. Rees, your Manager, has been ill. I trust that he is now fully recovered in health.

Referring to these two ships the Committee have asked me to point out that, under a strict application of the Rules, Special Surveys require to be held at about their due date and any postponement allowed should always be regarded as a concession rather than a right, particularly in cases such as these when the ships are 25 and 37 years old respectively.

With a view to meeting you as far as possible, however, they will be prepared to consider some postponement provided the vessels are slipped and submitted to general examination compatible with their ages at an early date.

The period of postponement will depend upon their condition as ascertained by the Surveyors and our Swansea Office is being requested to make amicable arrangements with you to this end.
