the survey has been completed.

Parts now examined:—

Port main engine Nos. 1 and 8 cylinders, covers, valves and valve gear, pistons, piston rods, guides and guide shoes, crossheads, connecting rods, the top and bottom end bearings and the crankpins.  
Port main engine centrifugal sea water circulating pump (psf).  
Port aft (No. 1) diesel generator engine and attached compressor over all parts.  
Port and starboard lubricating oil coolers.  
Donkey boiler feed pump.  
Donkey boiler in its entirety.  
Port and starboard screwshafts.  
Propellers, the sea valves (opened up) and their fastenings.
