This will acknowledge your letter and enclosures dated 5th March 1958.

The certificates have been handed over and the Owners are now hoping that the anchor and cable certificates be forwarded to you an early date, so that the Reclassification Cert. for the Hull may be issued.

In discussing the Annual Docking Survey, the Owners said that they are reluctant to bring their vessel back to Canary Islands, as there are no available cargoes for their vessel in this direction, and I advised them, that it may be possible, to arrange docking in Lagos or other African Ports, covered by the Surveyors, in that district, but if they intended to go there, that it would be well to write the Surveyor and advise him of their intention. There are cargoes offering sometimes to African Port.
