

This is to Certify that I have surveyed the M.S. "JOAN" 716 gross tons of Monrovia whilst in drydock at Coastal Dry Dock and Repairs Co. Staten Island N. Y. on the 26th November 1965 for damage stated to have been sustained by an explosion in No. 1 cargo tank (port) and subsequent grounding at the Standard Tank Cleaning Co. Pier, Bayonne N.J. on 8th November 1965 and that I am transmitting to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a report, stating that ~~all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, also that I am recommending that she be~~ continued as classed without fresh record of survey subject to further examination and repairs before proceeding to sea and to all outstanding conditions of class being dealt with as previously recommended.
