With reference to your letter of the 4th instant, I beg to inform you that I have never been unwilling to carry out the strengthening proposed. I have only asked Lloyd's for postponement until autumn, in order to combine this work with the usual docking and overhaul of machinery.

Honestly speaking, I think London is a little unjust when pointing out that already as long ago as the 26th September last you requested strengthening to be effected. I here beg to remind you that the ship was at the repairers at Amsterdam from the 1st to the 15th September last, and scantlings of several parts gauged. A recommendation or request of strengthening was made then. In addition the hull was placed in very good condition during the 1951 Special Survey in July 1951.

As mentioned previously no signs of fractures or the like have ever been observed on the "Skotaas". I can therefore not understand that now, the vessel having run satisfactorily for over 22 years, and the Owners always being painstaking (conscientious) regarding testing and renewals of plates and sections, it should suddenly and without fail become necessary further to strengthen the vessel.

I will, of course, never set myself against the recommendations of the classification society, but I think on the other hand that it ought to show some understanding.

I shall be glad if you will kindly take up the matter with London and anticipate your reply in due course.
