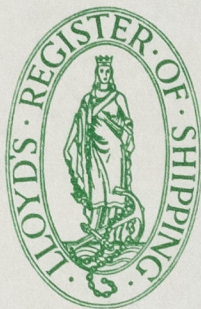



*and that I am transmitting to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a report, stating that all temporary repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, also that I am recommending that she be retained as at present classed in the Register Book with fresh record of Dry Docking 10.65 and subject to permanent repairs being dealt with in way of No. 2 D.B. Tank, Stbd. side etc. (renewal of Keel Plate No. 13 & bottom plates SC 12, SB 12, SD 7 & 8; and side plate PF 14) at the next routine dry docking (6 months).*
