Dear Sir,

We beg to acknowledge the receipt of your classing letter of the 31st March last in connection with Vancouver First Entry Reports Nos. 6046 and 6068, S.S. "MOUNT BRUNI PARK" and "SILVER STAR PARK" respectively.

We have to confirm that 36" horizontal girders were fitted to the transverse oil tight bulkheads, as indicated on the plans as built; that the material used in the construction of the vessels has been made by the open hearth process, and that the fore peak being a dry tank should not have been inserted in the Reports under "Particulars of Water Ballast".

We much regret that these matters were not made clear in the Reports, and shall be pleased if you will kindly make the necessary corrections, and have to point out that these should also be made in the case of the five sister ships, viz:-
