Messrs. The Sunderland Forge & Engineering Co., Ltd., of Sunderland, attend at their Works on the 21st July, 1944, for the purpose of witnessing tests on two direct current generating sets, Serial Nos. G.2696/7 and G.2698/9, each consisting of a 7" x 3" enclosed, forced lubricated steam engine suitable for a steam pressure of 100 lbs. per sq. inch. coupled to a 10 k.w., 110 volt, 850 R.P.M., continuously rated, compound wound generator, the sets having been built to the order of Messrs. Grangemouth Dockyard Co., Ltd., of Grangemouth, and being intended for installation on their Yard No. 458.

A full load temperature run followed by a run at 25% overload, governing, high voltage (dielectric) and insulation resistance tests were witnessed on each set, and the two sets were run satisfactorily in parallel.

Both generating sets were found, as far as can be seen, to be sound and free from defects and to comply with the Society's Rules for Electrical Equipment.

Copies of the Makers' certificates of tests are attached hereto.

For identification the generators were stamped on the yoke below the rating plate thus :-
