For Annual, Special or other Condition Surveys the Summary of Examination and Condition on the back of the Report is to be carefully completed and amplified if necessary in the body of the Report. Outstanding items to complete the Survey should be summarised at the end of the Report. The reasons for Repairs must be stated. Repairs on account of Damage (the alleged cause of which must be stated) should be separated from Repairs due to other causes, and, besides being detailed in the body of the Report, should be summarised in the form below. When, at a Special Survey, the Shell and Deck Plating is drilled the results must be reported on Report 8(Dr). Whenever Anchors or Chain Cables are replaced or retested the necessary particulars are to be given on Report 8(Eq) which is to be attached to this Report.

EXAMINATION AND REPAIRS AS PER RULE FOR DAMAGE & DOCKING.

Damage stated to have been caused through ship breaking adrift during a gale on 4th February 1957 at James Watt Dock, Greenock, when presently fitting out for completion.

Damage situated in way of bow plating, stem plating & stern frame & rudder.

Now Done: (Bow Damage) Fore Peak tank internally & externally examined.

Stem bar set over to starboard and badly buckled between 10' and 25' draught marks - cropped, removed, faired and re-fitted over approx 16 feet in length, cropped little chamfered and elec. welded and existing scarp joint re-riveted.

Stem Plating A. strake No. 1. (p. 25), indented at forward end, ~ cropped, removed, faired & re-fitted.
B. " No. 1. (p. 25) " " " " ~ cropped and part renewed.
D. " No. 1. (p. 25) " " " " ~ cropped and part renewed.
E. " No. 1. (p. 25) " " " " ~ cropped and part renewed.

Main Frame No. 190. (p. 25) removed, faired and re-fitted and solid deep floor in way cropped & part renewed for approx. 7 feet in depth.

On completion of permanent repairs, Fore Peak tank tested under pressure to Rule Requirements & found satisfactory.

Stem Plating - transverse plate in way of Rudder collar slightly set-up - faired in place.

Rudder collar plate removed, renewed & re-fastened.

Several shell rivets in way of after peak tank overhauled.

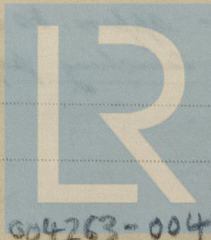
