—Tokyo, Dec. 24. —Steamer Adelphos Petrakis caught fire at Niihama to-day. The Japanese Maritime Safety Agency at Niihama said that no casualties were reported. The vessel was towed offshore to prevent damage to port installations.—Reuter.

—Tokyo, Dec. 24. —Steamer Adelphos Petrakis, on fire and in danger of capsizing, was driven ashore near Niihama to-day. Ten fire and patrol boats tried to control a fire in the ship's engine-room. Crew members left the ship after she went aground.—Reuter.

—Tokyo, Dec. 25. —Firemen to-day extinguished a blaze which burned for 28 hours in steamer Adelphos Petrakis, lying empty at Niihama. A spokesman for the Japanese agents said that it was feared that the vessel would have to be scrapped although the damage had not been estimated in detail. The Adelphos Petrakis was towed offshore yesterday to prevent the fire spreading ashore. Most of the crew of 29 were taken off while 10 fire-floats fought the flames.—Exchange Telegraph Company.

No. 1 hold about 4 ft. of water port side, No. 2 hold within 3 ft. of sea level, No. 3 hold at sea level, engine-room at sea level and fuel oil on surface, No. 4 hold about 4 ft. Strongly recommended owners arrange to pump out vessel urgently due stability danger. Pumping of engine-room complicated because of surrounding seaweed farms. Vessel anchored in nine metres of water. Fire has completely gutted engine-room with accommodation above. Ship's side and deck severely buckled in way of engine-room down to fourth below sheer. After pumping, have recommended owners prepare specification view estimating. Prime cause of fire obscure: will examine after pumping but said to have commenced under engine-room floor plates port side aft.—Salvage Association's Staff Surveyor.

—Steamer Adelphos Petrakis: Marine Safety Division will not allow vessel to be pumped out due oil in engine-room and possibility chemicals from fire-fighting in holds. Water level rising in No. 1 hold but list has decreased to 10 deg. Agent has arranged for analysis of water in holds.—Salvage Association's Staff Surveyor.
