EXAMINATION AND REPAIRS AS PER RULE FOR CONDITION

NOTE:- At the request of the Owners' Agents, Messrs. J.S. Nowry Ltd., a Condition Survey carried out as far as practicable whilst the ship lay afloat, laid up in the Gareloch for the purpose of issuing a certificate to permit the ship to proceed to a port on the West Coast of Europe under tow in ballast condition for breaking up.

NOW DONE:- An examination made as far as practicable of weather decks, superstructure bulkheads with their closing appliances, holds, casings, coamings, hatchways, closing and securing appliances, ventilators and other deck openings, windlass etc.

FOUND:- 1. Toggle fastenings of hinged steel covers of access hatches to Nos. 2, 3 & 4 tween decks rusted and siezed.
2. Steel hinged cover to steering gear access hatch hinge bound and toggle fastenings seized.
3. Forward entrance doors (p & s) to midship deckhouse hinges bound and toggle fastenings seized.
4. After end entrance door to deckhouse aft - lock defective.
5. 1 tarpaulin to supply and fit to Nos. 4 & 5 main cargo hatches.

1. Toggle fastenings of Nos. 2, 3 & 4 access hatches renewed or released as necessary.
2. Steering gear access hatch covers freed and toggle fastenings overhauled.
3. Midship deckhouse entrance doors (p. & s.f.) freed and made workable.
4. Door lock to aft deckhouse entrance overhauled.
5. 1 tarpaulin supplied and fitted to Nos. 4 & 5 cargo hatches.

RECOMMENDATION:—As a result of the foregoing survey it was considered that the ship was in a fit condition for the contemplated voyage to a port on the west coast of Europe under tow in ballast condition for the purpose of being broken up, provided that the port bower anchor be reconnected to the cable and that both bower anchors be securely housed in the hawse pipes, the towage arrangements being the responsibility of the Owners.
