SOURCE OF INFORMATION

JASON. — Taranto, Mar. 13.—SZXF (trawler Jason) sent SOS at 9 20 a.m., G.M.T., position lat. 38 5 N., long. 17 28 E.

Malta, Mar. 13.—Following received by Malta Radio from the master of trawler Jason, SZXF: Position lat. 38 5 N., long. 17 28 E., submerge.

Further signals state steamers Pace and Stratheden in the vicinity and proceeding to render assistance.

Niton Radio, Mar. 13.—Following received from British steamer Stratheden at 6 10 p.m., G.M.T.: XXX (urgency signal), position lat. 38 2 N., long. 18 2 E., approximately, all ships keep look out, about 20 men in the water. Trawler Jason, SZXF, has sunk. Am remaining in vicinity all night.

JASON.—Niton Radio, Mar. 13.—Following received from Taranto Radio at 11 18 p.m., G.M.T.: Following received from steamer STRATHEDEEN at 10 30 p.m., G.M.T.: Waterlogged empty lifeboat from steamer STRATHEDEEN (unread) approximate position lat. 38 2 N., long. 15 2 (unread). (See issue of Mar. 14.)

Taranto, Mar. 14.—British steamer STRATHEDEEN stood by this morning to pick up any further survivors after rescuing the skipper and some of the crew of the Greek trawler Jason. The Italian Navy Command here said the STRATHEDEEN, the Italian corvette Urania and an Italian rescue plane were still searching the heavy seas where the ship went down. Distress signals from the Jason were first picked up at mid-day yesterday. They said her engines had failed and she was in danger in a stormy sea.—Reuter.

London, Mar. 14.—The owners of the steamer STRATHEDEEN state that eight men were drowned when one of her lifeboats capsized in endeavouring to rescue crew of trawler Jason. So far, the skipper and three crew of Jason have been saved by the STRATHEDEEN.

Athens, Mar. 14.—Eleven of the crew of trawler Jason were drowned, together with seven (? eight) others from the STRATHEDEEN, when latter's rescue boat capsized, according to signals received at Piraeus. Of the crew of 15 of the trawler Jason only Skipper Kriparakos and three seamen were saved. The Jason left Piraeus on Friday (Mar. 11) on her way to Trapani. When near Cape Spartivento her batteries went dead and in a rough sea the ship lost direction.—Reuter.

JASON. — London, Mar. 14.—Steamer STRATHEDEEN reported this morning: Resumed voyage at 8 a.m., G.M.T., after further unsuccessful search. Have on board skipper, chief officer, radio officer and greaser of Greek ship Jason. Nos. 1 and 16 lifeboats lost. Estimated time of arrival at Marseilles 11 p.m. tomorrow, providing average weather. (See issue of Mar. 15.)
