Dear Sir,

In accordance with instructions sent from this office on the 13th November last, Mr. Douglas joined the Gibraltar Surveyor on the survey of the m.v. "NORRISIA", the Owners having requested a Special Examination of the ship with a view to it being towed to this country. Mr. Douglas advised us that he had received an advance of £20 from Mr. Cromby and he suggested that for his services a fee of £32 should be charged, plus £20 expenses. Whilst his proposed fee was concurred in, no details of his actual expenses had been included in his monthly A/c 7 of travelling expenses and on the 9th February we asked the Cadiz Surveyors to let us know the amount incurred. Despite a reminder sent on the 17th March and a cablegram on the 13th April no reply has, however, been received and in view of the time which has elapsed since the survey was held and the fact that the ship has now been sold for breaking up, it is essential that our account for the services of both Mr. Cromby and Mr. Douglas should be rendered without delay.

The following cablegram has accordingly to-day been sent to Mr. Jaroszynski:-

"NORRISIA NO REPLY RECEIVED MY CABLE THIRTEENTH AND PREVIOUS LETTERS STOP ESSENTIAL RENDER ACCOUNT TO OWNERS IMMEDIATELY STOP DOUGLAS NOT YET ACCOUNTED FOR ADVANCE FROM GIBRALTAR PLEASE CABLE AT ONCE AMOUNT OF EXPENSES ACTUALLY INCURRED"

Will you please take the matter up with Mr. Jaroszynski and ensure that the necessary
