the Owners' Representative attend the Steel Single Screw Steamer "ELGIN", 1906 tons gross register of Montreal, on 5th April, 1951 and subsequent dates whilst she lay on the blocks in Kingston Dry Dock after damage stated to have been sustained on account of Vessel's port side striking the Canadian Shipbuilding & Engineering Limited Coal Dock on 23rd January, 1951 while being towed by the tug "ASHTABULA" from the shipyard sheerleg berth to her winter mooring berth at the Canada Steamship Lines Shed at Kingston, Ont.

Upon examination, the undersigned

FOUND

Port Side counting from forward

Shell plate E10 set in.

Shell plate F11 set in.

Internally

5 side frames buckled.

3 side frames slightly buckled.

Bunker bulkhead wing plate buckled.

RECOMMENDED

To be cropped and part renewed and extended into E11.

To be cropped, part renewed and extended into F10.

Rubbing strap removed and new strap fitted in E strake.

To be removed, faired and replaced.

To be faired in place.

To be cropped and part renewed.

The above recommended permanent repairs having been satisfactorily carried out, the shell in way of repairs and the watertight bulkhead at shell were hoistested and found tight.

The above recommendations have been made with a view to the Vessel being restored as far as practicable, to the same condition as before the alleged casualty occurred.
