
PARTICULARS OF DEFECTS, REPAIRS, ALTERATIONS, ETC.

In SRL Appendix No.16.

"Instructions Part 3B 1957 amendment No.5 not yet complied with"

Due to the vessels limited time at this port the Chief Engineer requested that this item be deferred till the vessels arrival back at a U.K. Port.

The reason for repairs must be stated and those on account of damage, the alleged cause of which must be given, should be detailed separately from wear and tear repairs. State what action has been taken regarding items which are subjects of class. State also where appropriate, for the information of the Technical Records Dept., the material of the defective item and whether it is a forging, casting or welded fabrication. Any alterations in existing particulars in the Register Book should be reported above.
