Motorship "TOMAR"

When this ship was at Rotterdam during November, the Surveyors reported that the Main Engine No. 2 and 4 lubricating oil coolers were opened up for examination. Several tubes were found to be leaking and these were renewed. It was found however, that approximately 25% of the cooler tubes were clogged solid, and it was recommended that the Main Engine lubricating oil coolers Nos. 2 and 4 be re-examined and dealt with as necessary by May 1966.

The Committee have therefore continued the ship's class subject, only to this matter being dealt with as stated, and I shall be glad if you will inform the Owners accordingly.

According to the records in this Office, the following machinery items have not been seen for more than four years:-

- Main Engine S.W./F.W. cooling pump.
- Main Engine No. 3 connecting rod, and top end.
- Windlass.
- Centre main air receiver.
- Auxiliary electrical equipment.
- Pumping arrangements.

In the circumstances, the Owners should be requested to make the necessary arrangements for these items to be surveyed as soon as possible.
