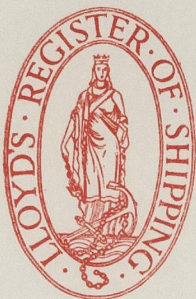

"ISERNIA" 580 gross tons of Grimsby for Docking, Boiler Survey and for General Examination, whilst lying on the Fish Dock Slipway, Grimsby, on the 31st August, 1965 and subsequently afloat, and that all my recommendations have been carried out to my satisfaction. I am reporting accordingly and recommending to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping that the machinery classification should be retained and the following survey records assigned M.B.S. 9,65.*
