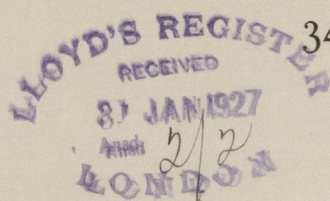

Sir,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 28th instant in regard to Glasgow Report No. 46270 on the steamer "HOMEWOOD", and in reply I beg to acquaint you that Mr. Pyle states that he has dealt with this case purely from the point of view of the efficiency and seaworthiness of the vessel, and, as stated on the Report, the defect is of such a nature in these respects that it may be left to be dealt with at the Owners' convenience.

If, however, there is any special reason, apart from the above, which, in your opinion, makes it desirable to omit the usual "subject clause" from the Classification Certificate, Mr. Pyle sees no objection to this.

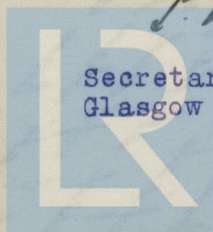
