Dear Sirs,

With reference to the classification in the Society's Register Book of the steamer "CANTICK HEAD", I beg to acquaint you the Committee have now had before them a report on this vessel received from the Society's Surveyors at Aberdeen to the effect that she has been examined on a pontoon at that port and the Second Special Survey No. 2 carried out as regards the hull. The machinery requirements of this Special Survey were, however, not fully complied with.

In normal circumstances the Committee would not assign a notation of the Special Survey until the Engine Survey had been completed, but this practice has been waived for the period of the War, and in view of this a record of "S.S.No. 2-43" has been granted on the understanding that the Machinery Survey will be completed as soon as possible without delaying the ship.

I may add that the Boiler Survey was carried out, and the vessel has been assigned a record of "B.S.9,43".
