(Continuous Liner) 3,55

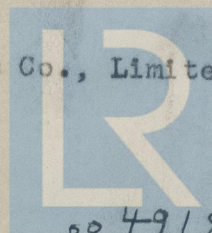
No periodical surveys were due at the time of the loss, but this Trawler was submitted to survey by this Society's Surveyors at Hull during the period 24th April, 1956, to 16th May, 1956, when the periodical Special Surveys of hull, machinery and boilers (which would have become due in August, 1956) were substantially carried out in dry dock, and the vessel would have been eligible to be assigned up-to-date notations in respect of these surveys upon satisfactory completion.

The case was submitted to the Committee on the 1st instant when instructions were given for the class to be deleted by the assignment of a notation of "Sunk by collision 5,56".
