SOURCE OF INFORMATION

ST. CELESTIN.—Oslo, May 27.—British trawler St. Celestin foundered to-day off Bear Island. The crew of 19 were saved and are understood to be uninjured, but have lost most of their belongings. The crew were taken on board the Hull trawler ARCTIC VIKING, and the skipper on board the Grimsby trawler Thomas Tompion. — British United Press.

Oslo, May 27.—Steam trawler St. Celestin sank after being in collision with steam trawler ARCTIC VIKING. The St. Celestin sank at 8 20 p.m., local time, Bear Island Radio said to-night. Some of the rescued men are reported to be suffering from shock, but are otherwise uninjured. The ARCTIC VIKING is understood to be slightly damaged on the waterline and is proceeding at reduced speed through heavy seas towards Tromso for repairs. The cause of the collision is not known. Bear Island Radio said that the sea was calm and the weather fine, but there were some banks of cloud over the sea. Bear Island Radio reported that the St. Celestin had made very good catches and was planning to start for home to-day, fully loaded. She would have been back in Hull in about five days. It was added that the ship sank within three or four minutes of the collision.—Reuter.

Hull, May 28.—St. Andrew's Steam Fishing Company, Ltd., Hull, state that their trawler St. Matthew, which has been fishing in the Bear Island area, is escorting to Tromso the Hull trawler ARCTIC VIKING, on board which are 20 survivors from Hull trawler St. Celestin.—LLOYD'S List Correspondent.

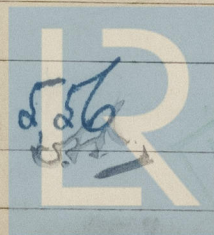
