Dear Sir,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 11th instant, respecting the case of the "MARGUERITE" and have to inform you that I examined the portable plate on the starboard side of the bridge front bulkhead, now fitted as follows, and found satisfactory: a plate 1/2 inch in thickness re-inforced by two vertical angles 4 3/4x4 3/4" secured by bolts and nuts 7/8 diameter maximum pitch 6" passing through the bulkhead plating.

I enclose herewith the verification form Rpt.12 (French).

at the British Isolation Hospital in Berlin
was given under my name and that of the
British Hospital and no names were mentioned
in the broadcast.

In order to avoid causing alarm, I
submitted a copy of the broadcast to the
Chief Surveyor of Ships, who is connected
with the Admiralty, and he advised me to do
so.
