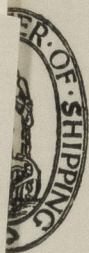

Dear Sir,

On the advice of the Khorramshahr surveyor who had previous surveys arranged in Iraq and Persia a Trip was made to Kuwait by the only aircraft available on the morning of the 5th August so as to be in a position to board the Steam Tanker "World Sky" due at 0700 on the 6th.

Despite numerous radio messages to the ship from Kuwait no further information was obtained regarding her arrival throughout Saturday the 6th and Sunday the 7th, we returned Bahrain Sunday evening, leaving word that this Port was to be informed when contact was restored.

Information has now been obtained through Lloyd's Agents that the ship sank late on the 2nd August in position 17.50 North 55.30 East whilst on passage Port Sudan, Kuwait.

The opportunity was taken however during this recent trip to inform the local Kuwait Shipping agents that until Mr. Gegan's return urgent cases would be handled from Bahrain while any job of which they had a few days notice should be referred through Khorramshahr.

We acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 2nd August regarding surveys at Kuwait.
