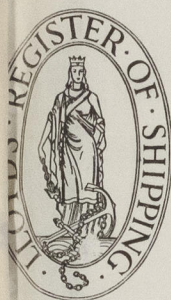

Surveyed the s.s. "HOLDERNIDD", 734 tons gross of Hull,
whilst lying in Hills Dry Dock, Cardiff, on the 3rd July,
1957 and subsequently for Annual Docking and examination
of outstanding damages,
and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's
Register of Shipping, London, a Report stating that all repairs
recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and
that I have Recommended that she be retained as classed
with fresh record of D.S. (Docking Survey) 7,57, subject to
permanent repairs to set over stem and stem plating; set in
plates D.2 & E.3 port side forward; and A.5 in 1st strake
below sheer on port side being effected at the next Special
Survey and to all these items being re-examined, and dealt
with as found necessary, at the next dry docking,
being fit to carry dry and perishable cargoes.
