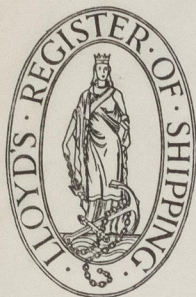


Messrs. Fisons Ltd., acting on behalf of Messrs. I.C.I Ltd., attend on board the Steel Screw Steamship "HOLDENHEDD" 734 gross tons of Hull, as she lay afloat at Cliff Quay, Ipswich, on 3rd November, 1956, in part loaded condition, in order to examine and report upon, without prejudice, damage stated to have been sustained to sulphate of ammonia cargo, during heavy weather, experienced between 30.10.56 and 1.11.56, whilst on passage from Middlesbrough towards Ipswich, with full cargo of sulphate of ammonia.

The ship is stated to have left Middlesbrough on 30th October 1956, and arrived at Ipswich on 1st November, 1956 - for full particulars see log books.

Upon examination a small quantity of damp cargo was found at the after end of No.2 hold, water having entered the hold through a defective shell plate, at the forward end of No.2 hold on the port side.

The very small amount of cargo affected was mixed with the dry cargo and successfully discharged to Messrs. Fisons Ltd., plant, at Cliff Quay, Ipswich.

Temporary repairs have been carried out by the Ship's Staff, with a cement box fitted in way of the defective shell plate, portside of No. 2 hold, and the vessel is now proceeding direct to the River Tees in ballast condition, where it is recommended that permanent repairs be carried out, before loading further cargoes.
