

Dear Sir,

With reference to the classification in the Society's Register Book of the steamer "TREGONHELL", which vessel has been laid up at Falmouth for some considerable time past, I beg to inform you that up to the present the vessel's class with this Society has been allowed to remain undisturbed in the Register Book on an undertaking furnished by the late Owners that the very much overdue Special Survey No.3 would be carried out before she again went into commission, and that if all overdue surveys were not carried out before she went to sea the class would be automatically cancelled.

It is understood that the vessel has recently been purchased by your goodself, and you were no doubt duly advised by the late Owners of the position regarding her classification, as mentioned above.

From information which has been received from the Society's Surveyors at Falmouth, it appears that the vessel is now about to leave that port without being submitted to their survey, although they approached your Agents and fully explained the position. As, however, they were informed that your Agents had received instructions from you that the

services of the Society's Surveyors were not required, the Committee, who have had the case under consideration, regret that they have had no alternative but to follow the procedure prescribed by the Society's Rules in such cases, and have accordingly given instructions for the vessel's class to be expunged from the Register Book with a Red Line, indicating non-compliance with the Rules.
