and that I am transmitting to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of
 Shipping, London, a report, stating that all repairs recommended by
 me have been completed to my satisfaction, also that I am
 recommending that she be continued as classed without fresh record
 of survey subject to the rudder being specially examined and
 dealt with as necessary at Sydney, N.S.W. where the vessel is
 now directly bound, the helm angle being limited to 25 degrees
 meanwhile but without conditions of class relating to the
 rudder stock and the set down upper deck plating, starboard side aft.
