Sir,

I am in receipt of the Liverpool freeboard report No. 78 on the Rescue Type Tug "ST. HILARY", and with regard thereto I have to point out that in previous vessels of this type, the moulded depth at the middle of the length is reported as 16-2", and a drop in sheer of 2 inches abaft the middle of length. I have therefore to request the Surveyor will state whether in this case the moulded depth given as 16 feet 2 inches is measured at the middle of the length, or at the lowest point; also if measured at the lowest point, whether the sheers furnished are given with relation to the height at the middle of the length or at the lowest point of sheer.

The approved plans, noted on the report as having been forwarded with the first entry report on the "ST. FAGAN" being now in the London office, are found, on reference to the report, to be noted as having been returned to your office on 30th July last. The approved sketch of midship section profile should be forwarded with your reply, for dealing with this case.
