The

undersigned recommended that it be fitted with two bands
in way of the fractures at neck bush, each band $6\frac{1}{2} \times \frac{3}{4}$ " in halves
thickened to 1" at bolt flanges, the tube cemented up in way & fitted with
a new neck bush.

The above recommendations were made to ensure
the vessel being in the same efficient condition as she was before
the damage was sustained.
